Many grants have guidelines that state application must be by a school P&C and not the school itself. It would not be an onerous task, as you will not have to hold sausage sizzles at supermarkets, or run tuckshops or fundraisers. The staff and I are hoping it would be a committee in name, meeting the minimal requirements for functioning, so we can use Maidavale P&C name and number for future funding applications and enterprises.




